Honorary Degrees תארי כבוד

Doctor of Humane Letters, honoris causa

Your extraordinary contributions to human rights, the fight against antisemitism, and Israel advocacy are respected around the globe.

Throughout your career, you have demonstrated leadership in the struggle against hate and injustice. You are the founder and international chair of the Raoul Wallenberg Centre for Human Rights, an Emeritus Professor of Law at McGill University, a former Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada, and an international human rights lawyer.

During your service as the Member of Parliament for Mount Royal between 1999 and 2015, you ceaselessly advocated for human rights and international justice. You chaired the first-ever Assembly of Parliamentarians for the International Criminal Court, the Parliamentarians for Global Action (Canada), the Inter-Parliamentary Group for Human Rights in Iran, and co-chaired the Interparliamentary Coalition to Combat Antisemitism.

As Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada from 2003 to 2006, you launched Canada's first National Justice Initiative Against Racism and Hate, initiated Canada's first legislation to combat trafficking in women and children, and initiated the first-ever prosecution for the genocide of the Tutsis in Rwanda under Canada's Crimes Against Humanity and War Crimes Act.

You have represented prisoners of conscience like Nelson Mandela and Natan Sharansky, among others, and have spent decades advocating for clear and consistent application of international law for the betterment of humankind.

You have been a leading voice working to combat unfair treatment of Israel on the international diplomatic stage, exposing the insidiousness of antisemitism masked as anti-Zionism. In 2020, you were named Canada's Special Envoy on Preserving Holocaust Remembrance and Combatting Antisemitism.

The recipient of many honorary doctorates—including an honorary doctor of laws degree from JTS presented at the Schechter Institute in Jerusalem in 2004—you were the first Canadian recipient of the International Raoul Wallenberg Foundation's Centennial Medal.

Your commitment to the pursuit of human rights and dignity for all has made the light of freedom shine more brightly around the world, and will for generations to come.

Professor Edward L. Greenstein

Doctor of Hebrew Letters, honoris causa

One of our generation's most prominent scholars of the Bible, you have made groundbreaking contributions to the fields of biblical, ancient Near Eastern, and Jewish studies.

You received BA and MA degrees from JTS, and BA, MPhil, and PhD degrees from Columbia University. Your years spent studying at JTS were formative. You came to see your academic biblical studies as authentically connected to the field of Jewish studies and the Jewish community. Your work has created a bridge between the academic and Jewish communal contexts, and you have shared your scholarship in Jewish education materials and divrei Torah alongside scholarly outlets.

You began teaching at JTS in 1976 and achieved the rank of professor in 1989. Your time at JTS left a lasting impression on faculty, colleagues, and students, and our ongoing mutual ties even after you made aliyah in 1996 have been a source of blessing to us both. You served as professor at Tel Aviv University and then at Bar-llan University, where you are presently professor emeritus of Bible. At Bar-llan, you headed the Institute for Jewish Biblical Interpretation and held the Meiser Chair in Biblical Studies. You have upheld the highest standards of scholarship while mentoring a generation of young scholars who are reshaping Israeli biblical studies.

The author and editor of numerous volumes, your 2019 *The Book of Job: A New Translation*—the winner of a finalist prize in the Jordan Schnitzer Book Awards of the Association for Jewish Studies—has been hailed as a revolutionary reinterpretation of the canonical text, proposing that Job, in fact, defied God until the end. For your work on this innovative translation, as well as your broader accomplishments in biblical research, particularly the comparison of Ugaritic and biblical literature while integrating varied research methods, you were awarded the EMET Prize—known as "the Israeli Nobel"—in 2020.

You have transformed biblical research, blending the Bible's study with Ugaritic and Akkadian literary research and integrating disciplines in a way that resonates not just in the world of scholarship but also for all who value Torah learning of the highest order.

Ms. Sherrilyn Ifill

Doctor of Humane Letters, honoris causa

A distinguished attorney, advocate, and leader, you have made historic contributions to racial justice, voting rights, and social equality, and your voice and vision have powerfully influenced our national dialogue.

You served as the seventh president and director-counsel of the NAACP Legal Defense Fund from 2013 to 2022, and currently serve as president and director-counsel emeritus. Only the second woman to head the organization, you provided far-sighted leadership during critical moments in our nation's history. You increased the visibility and engagement of the organization in litigating civil rights issues and elevated the organization's leadership in fighting voter suppression, inequity in education, and racial discrimination in the criminal justice system.

You have had a remarkable teaching career, spending 20 years on the faculty at University of Maryland School of Law. You taught civil procedure and constitutional law to thousands of students and pioneered a series of law clinics, including one of the earliest law clinics in the country.

Your writings have raised important questions about the complicated work surrounding historical reconciliation and presaged the social reckoning taking place today. You have published widely in both law journals and leading newspapers, and your 2007 book *On the Courthouse Lawn: Confronting the Legacy of Lynching in the 21st Century* is credited with laying the foundation for contemporary conversations about lynching and reconciliation. You are a frequent public commentator on racial justice issues, known for your fact-based, richly contextualized analysis of complex issues.

Among many honors, you have been inducted into the American Academy of Arts & Sciences, named Attorney of the Year by the *American Lawyer*, appointed to President Biden's Commission on the Supreme Court, and selected as one of *TIME* magazine's Women of the Year. This year, you will receive the prestigious Brandeis Medal, as well as the American Bar Association's Thurgood Marshall Award.

Your signal work overseeing a legal advocacy organization of historical import and impact, and your commitment to equal treatment for all citizens, is an inspiration to all.
